Family Garden Trail




Welcome to the Palace of Holyroodhouse gardens. Use this trail to explore royal history, nature, and wildlife in this beautiful space.





Step inside the Palace gardens - and remember to keep the path!

Before you go into the garden, look around the cobbled space outside the Abbey.



Believe it or not, this used to be the home of the Royal Animal Menagerie. Menageries were a collection of exotic animals. King James VI kept a lion, tiger and an ape!

This clever structure was designed to help tell the time using the light from the sun or the moon. It is nearly 400 years old and was made for Mary, Queen of Scots' grandson, Charles I. Mary liked spending time here too. She held a special type of tournament involving two knights on horse backing, carrying heavy lances charging towards each other.


Abbey Ruins

The Abbey used to be much bigger than it looks today. These are the ruins of the other half of the

Abbey. It was built in the shape of a cross.

Look carefully, can you make out the cross shape? (Remember to include the part of the building behind you.)

Look for a half circle of stones on the lawn nearby. This was originally an octagonal building, known as a Chapter House where the abbey monks, called canons, met daily to hear the chapter of rules read aloud.






Solider Guard box

When members of the Royal Family stay at the Palace, soldiers protect the building at the front and back.

Royal Staircase

The King and other members of the Royal Family use this stone staircase to walk down to the Garden Party, held here in the summer. The staircase is covered in a red carpet in preparation.

8,000 guests are invited to the party, 15,000 cups of tea are drunk, 9,000 strawberry tarts and 7,000 sandwiches are eaten. The serving table is 150 meters long! During the garden party, a brass band plays.
