


At the far end of the wall on your right, you'll find a picture of the countryside round Venice in the snow. It's by Marco Ricci and he liked dogs too.


The picture's full of mysteries.







Venice is especially famous for the canals that wind their way through the city instead of roads, where gondoliers once rowed people in their gondolas to the wonderful palaces, churches, markets and squares.





Cameras weren't invented, but there were lots of artists in Venice that visitors could buy pictures from to take home. **Canaletto** was one, **Marco Ricci** was another. Canaletto often put a little dog in his paintings of Venice. Keep an eye open for dogs in the pictures.


