


Teacher Information Pack Virtual Holyrood: Online Workshops for Schools

Mary, Queen of Scots

Enter the court of Mary, Queen of Scots. Find out about daily life in the Palace, and explore the Queen's private apartments before investigating the events of 9 March 1566 – the murder of Mary's secretary, David Rizzio.

Bonnie Prince Charlie

It is 1745 and music fills the Great Gallery, where Bonnie Prince Charlie and his supporters celebrate their recent victory at the Battle of Prestonpans. Find out why the Palace was so important to the Jacobites and what happened when the Prince set up court here for 5 weeks that year.

Queen Victoria

Step into Queen Victoria's Palace. Explore the stories of Queen Victoria's regular visits to Holyroodhouse and use real Victorian objects to find out about different jobs and pastimes in the Victorian era.
